Role title: Local Reserves Group Ranger.

Purpose of your role: To act as the “eyes and ears” of Warwickshire Wildlife Trust on the ground by visiting your nature reserve on a regular basis and reporting back any interesting sightings, vandalism, fly tipping, site safety issues or any other significant behaviour of others.

Tasks you will be involved with:

- Visiting your designated reserve on a regular basis.
- Reporting any issues to the relevant Reserves Officer.
- Litter picking.
- Snipping back any overgrown scrub.
- Promoting the Trust and the work it does to visitors to the reserve.

Skills and abilities required:

- Knowledge of your local area and nature reserve is beneficial.
- An interest in wildlife and conservation.
- An interest in the work of the Trust and your designated site.
- Good interpersonal skills, at all levels.
- Good organisational skills.
- High level of enthusiasm.
- Able to work independently and as part of a team.
- Ability to travel by use of own car or own form of transport.

You will be based at: Your local nature reserve.

Days and time we would like you to be available: Day and times that best suit you, with a site visit being carried out every 2-3 weeks.
